To that end we have completed the 38<sup>th</sup> year of our Christmas Giving Program. On Thursday, December 7<sup>th</sup> many volunteers and board members gathered at the Congregation Church of South Dennis for our Big Wrap. Over 2,000 thoughtfully chosen gifts were wrapped and then organized into beautiful gift bags decorated by students at the Dennis Union Church. On Saturday morning volunteers made deliveries to 135 seniors.

Many of these seniors live alone and were delighted when Santa's elves appeared with decorated bags filled with about 16 gifts each. Further details of those involved can be found inside this publication.

As phase two of the renovation of the Dennis Center for Active Living (DCAL) approached, the Friends were faced with finding a temporary office in July 2022. Thanks go to Donna Laurie at the Cape Cod Health and Fitness Center on Hokum Rock Road in South Dennis for renting us space within her facility. Contents of both the office and the Ickes Room were moved and stored at Compass Moving and Storage in South Dennis. On January 3, 2024, Compass Moving unloaded numerous storage items to our new office in the renovated DCAL. ## **ED'S GARDENING TIPS**

Hello gardeners, winter is here and it's time to tune up the yard equipment such as sharpening mower blades and garden shears. It's also a good time to plan your irrigation or soaker hoses for placement around your beds and con-

tainers to conserve water. Check storage areas for unwanted and outdated chemicals and dispose of them safely.

Plan to replace plants that have disease or pest problems. In early March prepare new beds and gardens by mixing in one to three inches of compost. Pull weeds when they first start growing, while the soil is moist, and roots are short before they go to seed. Harvest compost from your bin, and throw uncomposed sticks or stalks back in for another cycle.

#### THE VETERAN'S COLUMN

The U.S. Postal Service provides a critical service to the American public by delivering essential items such as prescription medications and medical supplies. U.S. Veterans depend on this critical service for reliable and timely deliv-

ery of their medications. According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, over 330,000 Veterans receive a prescription in the mail each workday. These prescriptions are fulfilled by a U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Consolidated Mail Outpatient Pharmacy. Packages shipped using the Postal Service accounted for a percentage of the VA Pharmacy medication packages shipped in fiscal year (FY) 2022. The Postal Service emphasizes the importance of accurate scanning as a measure of success for how well they deliver for their customers. From June 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, the Postal Service processed and delivered a number of VA Pharmacy packages.

#### What they did

The USPS's objective was to assess the Postal Service's processing and delivery of Veterans Affairs Consolidated Mail Outpatient Pharmacy medications. They interviewed Postal Service management, obtained, and analyzed Postal Service data, and visited Veterans Affairs Consolidated Mail Outpatient Pharmacy and third-party shipper locations to observe operations. Additionally, they judgmentally selected and visited 14 Postal Service facilities and interviewed local management and employees and observed processing and delivery practices for medication packages.

#### What they Found

The USPS found that while the Postal Service processed and delivered a large majority of the VA Pharmacy packages on time, the processing facilities visited did not always handle damaged medication packages or medication found loose in the mail as required by policy. In addition, they found Postal Service employees did not always accurately scan Priority Mail shipments and Veterans Affairs Consolidated Mail Outpatient Pharmacy packages processed and delivered through the Postal Service network.

#### Recommendations


The USPS recommended management develop and implement recurring training for handling damaged medication packages and medication found loose in the mail; develop and implement a process to review scanning performance; provide recurring training to employees responsible for conducting the scans and enforce compliance with scanning requirements; and develop and implement a control to prevent improper duplicate "Delivered" scans on the same package.
